EDUCATION: The Norma I. Love Foundation collaborated with the Health and Education Department personnel of Mocoron and went to the schools to teach the children about safety measures; specifically talking about the reasons for wearing masks, the correct way to wear a mask, using hand sanitizer, proper hand washing and social distancing to help everyone be a little safer and reducing the risk of getting COVID-19.



The students, parents and teachers of the Cacota community were very happy to receive donations from the Norma I. Love Foundation donors that consisted of school supplies of notebooks, pencils, crayons, markers, rulers, educational toys, school uniforms, clothes and shoes.



<u>HEALTH:</u> With the help of the Rotary Clubs of Texas and Roatan, donations of special medicines' were made available which helped the village clinics of Mocoron, Sirsirtara, Rondin, and the Puerto Lempira Hospital of La Mosquitia. The Norma I. Love Foundation and many villagers throughout La Mosquitia were grateful for these donations because the medicine was able to alleviate many illnesses.

ENVIRONMENT: The Project with Banco Mundial, Ayuda en Accion and the Yamny Iwanka Project, in conjunction with the Norma I. Love Foundation approved the project of establishing gardens and orchards with the Miskito families of Salto. These gardens and orchards include rice, corn, bananas, cassava, malanga, vegetable and fruit trees donated by Ayuda en Acción to 25 families in Salto.

The Pana Project which was created by German volunteers, Ayuda en Acción, the Yamny Iwanka Project, and the Norma I. These organizations helped by planting avocado grafts and provided them with new orchard trees with the vision that people can survive from their plantations if a horrible famine develops in the world.
